This was successful and made everyone much more aware. Jackie Kay believes that the Next Winter Wine Festival should be ok.

Helen Waterhouse will follow up with Alan Blackshaw regarding any further conversations he has undertaken.</p> <p>An assessment of all waterways and access points including the development of methodology and framework be incorporated and discussed at the next meeting of the Shoalhaven Access Advisory Committee after the draft report has been submitted.</p> <p>Helen Waterhouse was unsure who will be coordinating this, however the responses have been passed on to the consultant.</p> <p>It was last year the international interns audited all pontoons, jetties and ramps within the Shoalhaven and this information could be utilised as part of the assessment.</p> <p>Chris Braynt also mentioned that for Beach Access the wheelchair would need to be able to get from the car to a point to see the water and to not block the path in doing so and then to get down to the water. Brad Davis advised there is a pedestrian access mobility plan, as part of this \$60mil has been identified and prioritised on 'missing links' and proximity to schools and community groups build the paths. This has been cost effective and many footpaths are being constructed this way.
