Sarah Taylor – Manager South Coast Cooperative Libraries, provided the following overview of the 2016-2017 Annual Report.

- Over 18,000 items were purchased for the cooperative with a collection size of over 225.000 items.
- Continue to emphasise the use of technology to streamline processes.
- Online digital membership service is now possible 24/7 and has seen an increase in digital library members and access to digital services.
- SMS notifications have been introduced and are being used for book reservations, this is an automated service and will be used in the future for overdue notices.
- Updating library processes and procedures for management / updating database continues.
- Continuing to work together with Kiama Council in the South East Zone.
- Digital magazines are now available on line and good feedback has been received for both Shoalhaven and Kiama.

Michelle Hudson - Kiama Municipal Council Update

- Kiama Library has been involved in the Kiama Council initiative of becoming a Dementia Friendly community. The library building has been audited and a number of recommendations will be implemented over the coming months to provide the community with a more dementia friendly library space.
- A number of other programs including guest readers to the weekly story time sessions.
 Councillors Rice and Sloan participated in World Read Aloud day, beach and road safety information was delivered in a fun way in story time sessions.
- A Pop-Up library was also held at Blue Haven as part of Kiama's Seniors Week programs with library staff on hand to demonstrate the different library resources.
- Demand for Library Book Groups continues to grow, Kiama Library has started a Book Club collection for the use of Library Book clubs initially.
- A Friday Flick movie program has been introduced (one Friday each month) which is proving to be popular.
- Kiama Library was successful in obtaining \$60,500 for the digitisation project, Just a Minute
 as part of the Public Library Infrastructure grants. This project will include the
 implementation of a Digital Access Management system (DAM) and the digitisation of



historic Council Minute Books from Gerringong (1871-1954), Kiama (1859-1968) and Jamberoo (1891-1954). The DAM will also provide access to other digital resources including oral histories, images and documents when complete.

Sarah Taylor - Shoalhaven City Council Update

- Another successful year.
- The 'Librarian Rhapsody' YouTube video was very successful and has received great feedback.
- Other programs continue, for example, Storytimes & Rhymetimes book clubs.
- The new Paws 'n' Tails sessions are proving very popular.
- Other new initiatives include:
 - o Family History Talks
 - Building Brighter Babies Program, for which Shoalhaven Libraries received an IMB Grant which enabled them to provide a library bag and book to each new child born in the Shoalhaven local government area.
 - Pathfinders Volunteer Program
- Development of digital library services is ongoing for Nowra Library.
- New mobile shelving & planning is ongoing.
- There are new staff at the Sanctuary Point library and the new fixed iPads are proving to be popular.
- Ulladulla Civic Centre celebrated its first birthday and the library continues to increase its programs and services.
- Currently working with Friends of Milton Library to increase the Milton Library's opening hours and provide additional services to borrowers.
- A regular training program has been developed to upskill and cross-train staff.
- Providing internet and technology training for seniors.

LS16.2 New Library for Gerringong

Kiama Council has received funding to build a library at Gerringong. The library will be located in Blackwood Street behind the Arts Building. It is hoped that building will begin in mid-2017.

LS16.3 South Coast Cooperative Libraries - Collection Development Policy

Michelle Hudson and Sarah Taylor will work on the review of the South Coast Cooperative Libraries - Collection Development Policy. The policy is due for review in December 2016.

LS16.4 Funding Library Services

The South Coast Cooperative Library Service is a partnership between Shoalhaven City Council and Kiama Council. Shoalhaven City Council is responsible for the acquisition and cataloguing of library items for Kiama Council and in addition the two Councils work together collaboratively to provide library resources and services to the community.

The South Coast Cooperative offers its customers a collection of over 250,000 items in both physical and digital formats, with over 19,000 physical items added this financial year. Over 600,000 people have visited one of our branches this year and it is clear from these figures that libraries provide a vital community space.

The South Coast Cooperative Library Service remains a strong and dynamic partnership and continues to grow this collaboration for the benefit of both communities.

Cooperative Manager's Report

It's been another fantastic year for the South Coast Cooperative Libraries and Shoalhaven City Council and Kiama Council continue to grow and evolve as a vibrant partnership. Libraries provide a vital community space and this is reflected in the increase in visits, which has seen over 600,000 people come into our library branches this past year. In addition to physical visits there has also been an increase in customers interacting with our libraries digitally and making use of our eBooks, eAudiobooks, eMagazines and databases. The South Coast Cooperative offers its customers a collection of over 250,000 items in both physical and digital formats, with over 19,000 new physical items added this financial year. The South Coast Cooperative Libraries is also part of a larger network of public libraries, the New South Wales South East Zone, and through this collaboration is able to offer over 60,000 eBook and eAudio titles and over 370 eMagazine titles.

The Library Management System (LMS), Libero, has had another upgrade which allows for increased functionality that benefits staff and customers. Technology remains a focus for the library and it is used to assist customers

and staff alike in providing an accessible and agile service. Digital information and literacy also forms a core component of the services that contemporary libraries now provide through access to digital technology and assistance with its use.

Our multi-skilled library staff are resourceful and always deliver exceptional customer service that is responsive to the community's needs. Their passion and energy enables the Cooperative to provide increased services and programs to its customers.

As always a big thank you to partner Library Manager Michelle Hudson for her ongoing support and professionalism. The South Coast Cooperative remains a strong and dynamic partnership and I look forward to continuing to grow this collaboration for the benefit of both communities.

I take pleasure in presenting this Annual Report from the South Coast Cooperative, which highlights the many services, resources and programs that are provided to our communities.

Shoalhaven Libraries Annual Report 2016-2017

Shoalhaven Libraries is a vital part of Council services, supporting the social, educational and recreational development of the local community. It offers a safe space where all members of the community are able to come, and provides vital resources for people that might not otherwise be served or feel integrated. The library service continues to thrive as a whole and each individual branch caters to the needs of its unique community.

The refurbishment of Nowra Library is nearing completion. The library's interior painting has been completed and over 75% of stock is now on moveable shelving, which allows more flexibility in use of the public space as the library responds to community needs. A café has recently been added in its foyer area, which has proved popular with customers and staff alike. The 'book-themed' café serves coffee, light refreshments and gelato and provides an attractive entrance to the library.

Ulladulla Library has recently completed a mini refurbishment with the creation of an additional technology area, allowing the physical space to remain fluid and responsive as the library accommodates the changing needs of the community. This area has additional power points and desks which many people use as a work, study and leisure space. The multi-use centre, including a Visitors Centre and function facilities has seen increased usage and is a popular community space.

Our smallest district library at Sanctuary Point remains as always a much loved community asset and has had another successful year of providing excellent programs and services. Despite an undersized space and small staff allocation Sanctuary Point continues to provide amazing services from a dedicated and professional team.

The Mobile Library has seen increased usage this year as a result of better timetabling and marketing. Shoalhaven Libraries has also been successful in receiving a Public Library Infrastructure grant of \$140,000 for the purchase of a customised library van. This smaller van will provide a library service to the Southern Shoalhaven, while the larger vehicle will continue to provide a library service to the North. The mobile library is an integral part of the services provided to our region by Shoalhaven Libraries and this extra vehicle will still offer a traditional mobile library service, but moreover enable increased access to library services and staff by the community. The service will offer internet connectivity and assist with the expansion of the current Home Library Service, as well as extending to pre-school, primary and high school visits, library presentations and other outreach activities.

Milton Library has seen increased hours of operation thanks to the volunteers from 'Friends of Milton Library'. Milton Library is now open three days per week – Monday, Wednesday and Friday – from 9am to 5pm. In



addition to increased opening hours volunteers are also providing services, such as youth book clubs and 'Friends of Milton Library' is looking to explore further services and programs that can be offered to their community.

magazine' databases being added this year. We advertise in the local paper, on our website, social media channels, flyers, radio interviews and word of mouth, and this year have targeted local schools so that they know about the great resources available for their students.

Programs and Events

Shoalhaven Libraries runs a successful suite of programs, such as Storytimes & Rhymetimes, Third Wednesday Book Club, Tech Tuesdays, Family History Talks and Pathfinders Volunteer Program, to name just a few. As well as our regular programming we have also introduced some new programs that are proving to be popular. The GenConnect Intergenerational program connects young people and seniors with the aim of improving intergenerational relationships and technology skills. During these sessions seniors are paired with a younger person who helps them with any technology issues they may have. We have also launched a movie screening program at both our Nowra and Ulladulla branches, which shows a monthly movie for all to enjoy.

There have also been a lot of great author events and book launches and over the past year we've welcomed many authors including Tony Park, Julie Ankers and Anne McLeod. In addition there have been many school holiday activities and one-off events, such as the Great Intergenerational Bake Off, which celebrated Grandparent's Day, Book Week and many more. In total there have been more than 400 events held at our different library branches with over 8,500 people attending.

The library team is extremely proud to have won a first prize award in the Social Media Category of the NSW Public Libraries Marketing Awards for their 'Librarian Rhapsody' YouTube clip, which to date has had over 320,000 hits. The promotion of our resources and services has been a key focus this year. We want to let the community know what great free resources are available for them and we continue to review and improve our website (www.shoalhavenlibraries.com.au), online public catalogue and use social media to connect with our customers.

Technology

Shoalhaven Libraries is an important digital resource for the community. The public access computers and free WiFi at all our branches have seen increased usage over many years now. In addition the technology assistance is still an area where there is much need and assistance required. Tech Tuesday, technology classes and one-on-one sessions continue to prove popular.

We offer a diverse range of digital resources and this collection has increased with 'HSC Study Lab' and 'Choice

Staff

Staff have continued with their professional development by attending forums, seminars and training courses. Shoalhaven Libraries was fortunate to host the Public Libraries New South Wales Annual SWITCH Conference in November 2016 at the recently refurbished Ulladulla Civic Centre. It was a fantastic conference and also provided the opportunity for many Shoalhaven Libraries staff to attend the conference and listen to speakers such as Deng Adut, Gillian Hicks and Leigh Hobbs.

Training is an important part of ensuring that staff have the skills and knowledge to assist our community. This year has seen the development of a staff training schedule, with the aim of providing staff with the necessary skills and knowledge in order to assist customers and to stay current with the fast changing digital world.

A big thank you to our wonderful volunteers who assist in many ways. It's great to have so many talented community members offer their time and skills to the library service, which assists with service provision and provides additional resources and expertise.

Conclusion

It's been another fantastically busy year of events, activities, challenges and growth, and as always the delivery of a high standard of service. A big thank you to the staff at all our branches who are enthusiastic, professional and dedicated. We provide a wonderful service to our local area and strive to always deliver what the community wants and needs.

Kiama Library Annual Report 2016-2017

The past year has been a mixture of highs and lows in the library as we experienced the successful outcome of our first Readers Festival and then the tragic news of the unexpected passing of our colleague Ken Donnellan on Friday 23rd of December.

Ken Donnellan, our Information Services Librarian since 2013, had developed a passion for local history and in particular researching the lives of our local WW1 soldiers. What started out as Kiama Library's contribution to the Illawarra Remembers 1914-1918 project, soon developed into something much bigger. Ken shared his research with local RSL groups and Historical societies and had nearly completed a book on the subject. It was the wish of his family that the book be completed as a tribute to his dedication to our local history. Ken's book The Names on the Wall: Gerringong Soldiers Memorial Hall, will be launched in November by library staff.

Kiama Library in partnership with The Friends of Kiama Library held the inaugural Kiama Readers Festival over three days in October 2016. The aim of the Festival was to promote a love of reading by providing a range of programs for all ages. A sold out launch event saw philosopher and writer Damon Young explore the concept of reading and how we learn to turn words into worlds as he shared revelations of his own bookish life.

Eleven author sessions were held at The Pavilion Kiama on the Saturday with over 15 authors in attendance. Authors appearing included Meg Keneally, Kate Llewellyn, Kooshyar Karimi, Jim Haynes, David Dyer among others. The Festival dinner featuring husband and wife team Richard Glover and Debra Oswald discussing A Writers Life was also another sold out event. Festival activities continued on the Sunday for children with well-known authors Ursula Dubosarsky and Anna Feinberg providing a range of activities at Kiama Library.

Feedback from the participants was overwhelmingly positive so plans were made to hold a Festival dinner in May 2017 where popular Australian-British author Kathy Lette spoke about her most recent book Best Laid Plans to an audience of over 200. Another three-day Festival event is planned for May 2018.

In December we launched our Jamberoo Street Library. Part of the Street Library movement this service provides an invitation to share the joy of reading with the local community. Books can come and go without anyone checking them in or out. People simply take what interest them and when they are done they can return them to the Street Library or pass them on to friends. This service was a big hit with holiday visitors over the Christmas New Year period and is now supported by a library volunteer to ensure it is well stocked with great titles for all ages. Plans are in place for providing a Street Library in the Gerringong township.



As part of our annual Book Week celebrations a Story Book walk and a pop up library were part of the weekly Kiama Farmer's Market. The community were invited to stroll along our Book Walk, read a picture book, and complete colouring in activities. Three local schools also visited the library to take part in our annual Book Week programs.

Federal funding for the Gerringong Library, Museum and Community Facility was announced in December with plans to start the project in March 2018 with an anticipated completion date of February 2019. This long awaited project will provide much larger library facilities, additional operating hours with areas dedicated to children's activities and community meeting rooms. Library staff are currently working with the Gerringong & District Historical Society volunteers to explore how we can cooperatively work together to provide better access to our collections, programs and leverage visitation to the facility. In anticipation of the new library building, Gerringong Library is now open additional hours on Tuesdays from 9.30am to 12.30pm.

The library has introduced the Friday Flicks program after following up on a comment made by a community member about the difficulties they had in getting to the cinema in the neighbouring LGA. A monthly screening of recently released movies to DVD, with a book tie-in wherever possible, in the library auditorium has proved very popular with sold out events occurring every month.

Friends of Kiama Library

As well as supporting the Kiama Readers Festival both financially and by volunteering for the Festival committee, the Friends of Kiama Library continue to provide an exciting variety of monthly programs encouraging members of the community. This year audiences enjoyed presentations from authors Di Bates and Bill Condon,

The Friends have also proved financial support for our HSC and Lock In programs for young adults, annual photographic competition and our Street Library projects.

Professional Development

Library staff continue their professional development by attending a number of conferences, seminars and training in 2016/2017


