PROPOSAL

MURAL PROJECT & COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT

NOWRA CBD

The core team at Collator have lead various council, school and community engagement projects over the past decade working with pre-school, primary and secondary students, community members and professionally practicing artists.

We work across a range of creative practices exploring expressive forms, ideas, and values through immersive experiences for communities, art making, poetry and creative writing workshops, graphic design and murals.

The work that gives us the biggest thrill are the projects centered around a passion for the environment and community building, holding hope for the future, and giving children the confidence and tools to express themselves and learning outcomes through art making - and positive place-based experiences.



PROGRAM

We would like to propose the installation of a mural on the wall of the Throughfare Laneway, adjacent to the Arts Centre in the Nowra CBD.

This laneway currently has murals that were created in response to its opening in 2015. It is time for a refresh. We would like to reinvigorate the walls with the involvement of pre-school aged children. Not only do we want to reinvigorate the walls of the laneway withthe 'voices' of the young people – not just pre schoolers, but primary and youth as well – we would like to activate the space with an event.

We have connected with Beyond Empathy, Shoalhaven and would like to included in the event, a 'podformance' – this is a live podcast performace, by the youth that they work with in the Shoalhaven area.

While Collator works with the younger, pre school & primary aged children - our good friend & street artist, Bohie will work with the older youth to run empowering mural workshops.

Our friends at Hoorah Events would dress the space and help create a fun and vibrant event.

She is known for her bold use of colour, is not afraid of putting paint on anything, and is a firm believer that *it is about what happens during the making process rather than what is left behind.*

Bonnie is represented by Gallery Jennings Kerr in NSW and was the recipient of a 2022 Shoalhaven City Council Australia Day Award for Outstanding Contribution to Arts & Culture.

Nicole Smede (poet)

Nicole is a multi-disciplinary artist of Worimi and European descent, living and creating on Wodi Wodi Country.

Proud of her heritage, she works through language to reconnect to ancestry and culture. A classically trained Mezzo Soprano, she ran away from classical music early on to pursue wider artistic interests. Now, Nicole uses voice, song, sound and poetry to explore ideas around landscape and connectedness, making sense of her place in the world, reclaiming and reconnecting to ancestry.

In 2020, Nicole was the co-recipient of the 2020 Shoalhaven Arts Board Grant with Bonnie Porter Greene, a finalist in the Meroogal Women's Art Prize and shortlisted for the 2020 Red Room Poetry Fellowship. Her work is acquired and held in national collecting institutions.

RECENT PROJECTS 20x20x12 Sensing Place BOOK & EXHIBITION

In 2021, Bonnie & Nicole published *20x20x12 Sensing Place*, (Manta Publishing). Over the course of a year, 12 sets of unique works were created from seasonal expeditions to regional sites. Through creative meditation and reflection, the artists connected to 'place', forming artistic responses to each site, revealing the essence of landscape. Through this creative lens, the viewer is invited into vast and deep experiences, linking cultural stories through the window of the 20cm x 20cm format.

Each month, over a year, the artists travelled together to a different location in the Shoalhaven region. Spending time connecting to 'place', they individually responded to the site through painting and poetry.

This project formed the basis for Bonnie & Nicole's working relationship, and attitude toward involving children in observing, reflecting and respecting nature. The published book was made possible as recipeints of a 2020 *Shoalhaven Arts Board A Sense of Place Grant.*

Poetry Is Story Wollongong City Council POETRY WORKSHOPS, BOOK & PUBLIC LIGHT BOXES

In 2020 we were commissioned by Wollongong City Council to contribute to the Corrimal Public Art Project by running poetry workshops with Corrimal primary and secondary schools for a publication and community exhibition space at St Luke's Place Playground, Corrimal.

Over two weeks, we spent time with students and traditional custodians writing poetry in response to landscape and First Nations stories. We curated and edited the publication *Poetry is Story* published by Wollongong City Council, to include poems written by the students and sections of a collaborative mural design that formed part of the overall public art project.

Fragments of the poems were also included and woven into the artwork on a series of solar powered pillar lightboxes installed in public playground St Luke's Place. These continue to be a source of inspiration and pride for the community, celebrating shared connection, history and stories of place.





This project is about story, the sharing, retelling and creation of story through poetry, Traditional Owners shared personal and Dreaming stories through yarning circles, hispiring students from three local schools to create narratives through the use of poetic imageny, reflecting a deep connection to spirit and place.






RECENT PROJECTS The Day She Stole The Sun. Cobargo Public School BOOK DESIGN IN COLLABORATION WITH STUDENTS


