Pursuant to section 4.15(1) (b) Environmental Planning and Assessment Act 1979, the proposal is considered to have an unsatisfactory amenity impact on the southern neighbouring property, due to the non-compliance with the Shoalhaven development Control Plan 2014, Chapter G13 side setback of the upper floor of Dwelling 1. The two storey elements of both dwellings will result in adverse overshadowing on the neighbouring property to the south. Additionally, the two storey elements will result in adverse privacy impacts for adjoining properties.
- 2. Pursuant to section 4.15(1) (c) Environmental Planning and Assessment Act 1979, the proposal is considered unsuitable for the site, as the development is out of character with the neighbourhood. The proposed development is of a bulk and scale that is unsympathetic to the character of the locality typified by single storey residential development. Furthermore, the proposal is incompatible with the streetscape and character of the locality due to the proposed subdivision pattern, resulting in a battle axe arrangement atypical to the area, which also does not comply with the relevant standards contained in the Shoalhaven Development Control Plan 2014, Chapter G11, driveway width.



- Pursuant to section 4.15 (1) (c) Environmental Planning and Assessment Act 1979, the
  proposal is considered unsuitable for the site, given stormwater issues in the locality. The
  applicant has not demonstrated that there is sufficient capacity within the stormwater network
  to accommodate the development.
- 4. Pursuant to section 4.15 (1) (e) of the Environmental Planning and Assessment Act 1979, the proposal, for the reasons listed above, is not considered to be in the public interest.
