

Each of the participants introduced themselves to the meeting and identified how they were feeling coming into today's meeting.

Jessica Richardson - Community Capacity Builder – asked the members present to consult and identify the top three things that you hear friends/ peers talking about that affect them? The following issues were identified:

- Stress and anxiety in relation to:
 - Assessment tasks;
 - Other school issues;
 - o Personal life and the influence family life has on studies;
 - o Current situations around the world the war in the Ukraine

- Even though the COVID-19 situation has improved, there is still post stress and mental health issues affecting the youth;
- The ever changing learning situations (online / in person) due to recent floods as well as the COVID-19 pandemic
- Drugs & alcohol use:
 - Substance abuse and/or experimenting with drugs and alcohol due to stress and uncertainty, particularly amongst Senior students;
 - \circ Pressure to try it.
- Impact on University students:
 - Leaving high school and having to adjust to online learning with Uni.
 - Very isolating with no opportunity to socialise or make new friends or connections.
 - Not having options to learn in the best way for you personally due to online learning.
- Expectations and pressure that are placed on young people in relation to schooling and socialising including expectations that young people place on themselves.

Jessica Richardson – Community Capacity Builder - advised that Bridget and Veronica would like the opportunity to have more conversations with the Youth Advisory Committee and their peers to share actionable ideas on how Council may be able to provide youth programs for youth development.
